Certificate Program in Sustainable Development Within Planetary Constraints

Successfully meeting the global climate challenge requires the full participation and ownership of emerging and developing economies as well as a strengthening of their capacity to prepare for and respond to climate change. The Emerging Policymakers Program is a fully-funded, 3-month executive training course on sustainable development and climate policy aimed at building capacity of early-career rising star government officials of emerging and developing economies from ministries involved with infrastructure and climate policy, notably the Ministry of Finance.

Program Overview

The Emerging Policymakers Program is a collaboration between Tsinghua University School of Economics and Management (Tsinghua SEM), the London School of Economics (LSE), and the Leadership Academy for Development (LAD), a project of the Center on Democracy, Development and the Rule of Law, part of Stanford University's Freeman Spogli Institute for International Studies, with teaching and training support from the Asian Infrastructure Investment Bank (AIIB). This program is designed to equip participants with the latest academic and practical knowledge on the global fight against climate change. After the completion of the program, participants will also be able to apply for secondment opportunities at AIIB, under the Bank's existing secondment program.

Global governance is key to efficient solutions for sustainable development and addressing global challenges. Awareness and clear vision of global governance are important for officials from emerging and developing economies.



The net zero transition necessitates major investments in building state capacity, including through capacity building of officials in government agencies overseeing climate policy.

Highlights and Key Outcomes

The impact of the program will be visible in successive cohorts of government officials from emerging and developing economies that are:



embedded in key climate policy positions in their home countries



equipped with the latest knowledge on climate policies, financing options, transition pathways and investment opportunities



able to influence domestic policy actions to address climate change

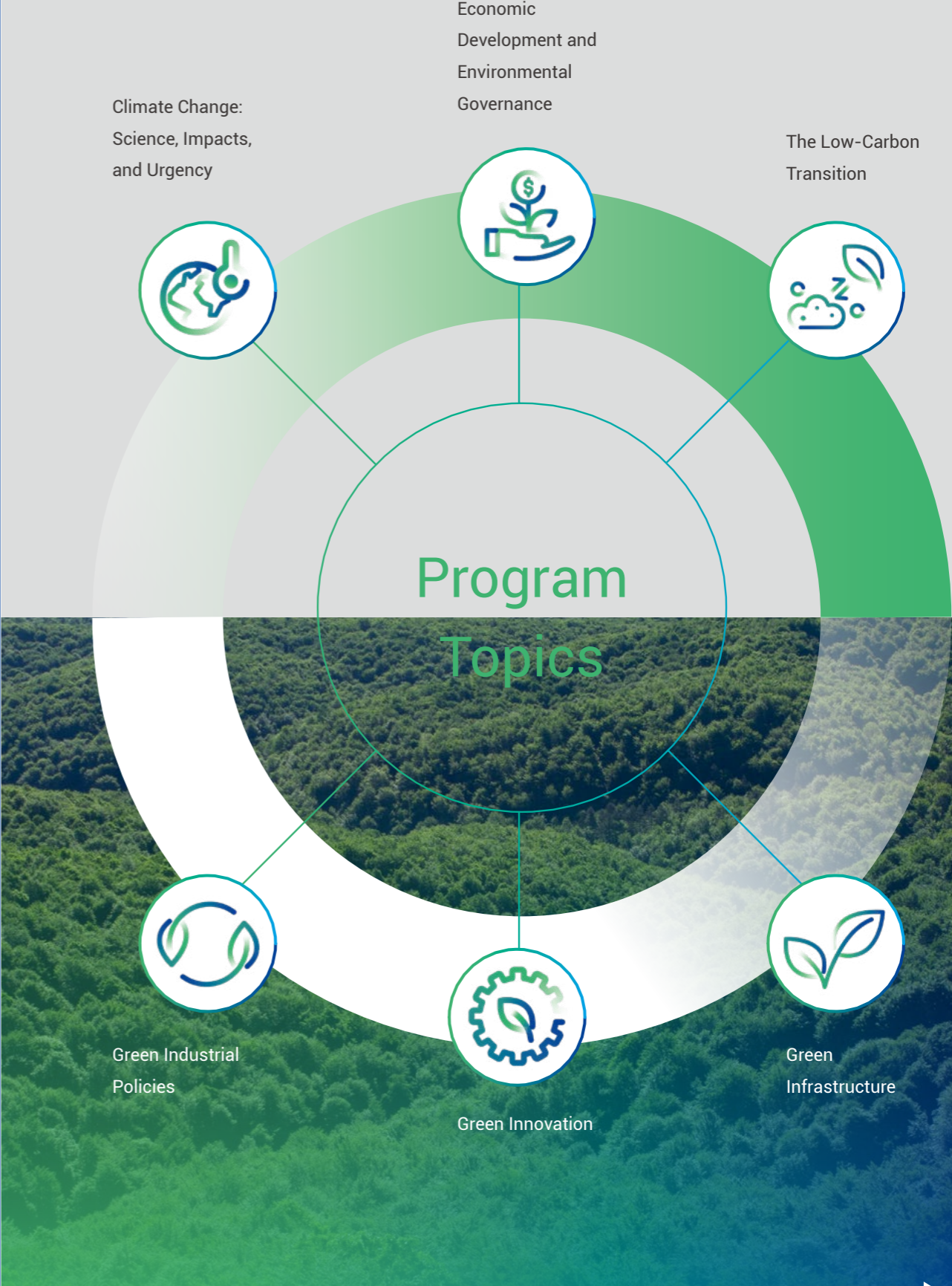


more effectively able to lead interactions with external stakeholders, including global for climate action, MDBs, IFIs, the private sector and philanthropic organizations, and



part of a greater collaboration among countries in the Global South on knowledge sharing and coalition building on key issues related to the global climate transition.

The outcomes will be visible in the form of strengthened capacity for climate-resilient investment, advanced policy formulation and implementation skills, increased investment in climate resilience and adaptation, and enhanced global collaboration on climate action.



Admissions

Modalities

Physical Component at Tsinghua University:

One month of in-person discussions, case studies, seminars, and field visits.

Online Component:

Two months of theoretical concepts and applications, with live and recorded sessions.

Dates & Fees

In-person Modules

LAD Case-Study Course:

March 24th to 28th, 2025, will be held in Beijing

Tsinghua Course:

March 31st to April 18th, 2025, including a week-long visit and research trip to a city outside of Beijing

Virtual Modules (live)

· May to June 2025 (total of 8 weeks)

· Two 3-hour sessions per week, delivered by Tsinghua, LSE and AIIB

Language

All sessions are in English, with simultaneous translation for Chinese sessions.

Tuition Fees

Full scholarships cover tuition, accommodation, and travel within China, excluding international airfare.

Course Study Certificate

Upon successful completion of the course, participants will be awarded a Course Study Certificate.

Admissions Criteria

- 1 **Belong to a low or middle-income country**
- 2 **Work on climate-related issues in government ministries involved with infrastructure and climate policy, notably the Ministry of Finance**
- 3 **Have 5-7 years of work experience**
- 4 **Hold at least an undergraduate degree**
- 5 **Be proficient in English**

Application Process

Submit the application form to exedglobal@sem.tsinghua.edu.cn between 1st January and 15th February, 2025.

Candidates will undergo a personal interview with the Tsinghua admissions team between January and February, 2025.

The Admissions Committee will evaluate all applications, and admission decisions will be communicated to candidates in February 2025.
